

IX. PRESS IN STATES AND UNION TERRITORIES

9.1.1. The Indian Press spread over 29 States* and 7 Union Territories, has shown phenomenal growth in terms of both the national as well as regional media, which play a significant role in moulding public opinion. This is evident from the statistical data collected over the years.

9.1.2. The Annual Statements received from the publishers online for 2014-15 indicate that Uttar Pradesh retained the top position in filing annual statements with 5,506 publications (newspapers & periodicals). Madhya Pradesh came second with 2,494 and Delhi third with 2,465 publications (newspapers & periodicals). (Table 3.2)

9.1.3. The total number of registered publications (newspapers & periodicals) went up in all the States and Union Territories except Lakshadweep & Nagaland during the year under review.

9.1.4. As far as the registered publications are concerned, Uttar Pradesh continued to be the largest publisher with 16,130 publications (newspapers & periodicals) followed by Maharashtra 14,394 and Delhi 12,177. (Chapter 2 Table 2.4)

9.1.5. Odisha was the state which brought out publications in 20 out of 23 principal languages listed in the Eighth Schedule of the Indian Constitution followed by Maharashtra in 19 and Delhi in 17 languages. Almost all States and Union Territories had newspapers in Hindi except Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura and Lakshadweep.

9.1.6 As many as 23,394 publications (newspapers & periodicals) filed their Annual Statements online for the year 2014-15, which represents an increase of 18.99% per cent as compared to last year. Circulation-wise the press in Uttar Pradesh retained its top position with a combined circulation of 11,94,47,265 copies, followed by Delhi with 6,36,22,042 and Madhya Pradesh with 4,45,95,039 copies per publishing day.

9.1.7. A list of 'large' 'medium' and 'small' publications in each State and Union Territory with their claimed circulation is given in Appendix I. An analysis of the status of the Press in various States and Union Territories along with their circulation is given as under:

Registered Newspapers

9.2.1. One Multi-lingual Fortnightly publication was registered in the year 2014-15. Raising total number of registered publications to 86 comprising 17 dailies, 27 weeklies, 22 fortnightlies, 16 monthlies, 2 quarterlies and 2 of other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.2.2. Out of total 86 registered publications, only 11 publications filed their annual statements for 2014-15 comprising 10 dailies, 1 weekly. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.2.3 Total claimed circulation was 1,10,356 copies per publishing day. English Press remained the largest with 50,641 claimed copies followed by Hindi 37,848 copies. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.2.4. All 6 publicaions were being published from UT.

Leading Newspapers

9.2.5 “*Satya Priya*”, a Hindi/daily with the circulation of 25,100 copies per publishing day from Port Blair was the highest circulated publication.

Registered Newspapers

9.3.1. A total number of 194 new publications were added during 2014-15. Of these, 78 were dailies, 27 weeklies, 13 fortnightlies, 71 monthlies, 3 quarterlies and 2 of other periodicities. Thus the total number of registered newspapers & periodicals has gone up to 6,215, comprising 1,598 dailies, 9 tri-bi weeklies, 1,133 weeklies, 769 fortnightlies, 2377 monthlies, 180 quarterlies, 8 annuals and 141 other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.3.2. Annual Statements were received from 1,648 publications i.e. 910 dailies, 194 weeklies, 130 fortnightlies, 399 monthlies, 12 quarterlies and 02 others. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.3.3. Data received from 1,648 publications claiming a total circulation of 3,25,97,949 copies per publishing day. Language-wise, Telugu publications had the major share in the total claimed circulation consisting of 2,37,87,975 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.3.4. as many as 973 publications were being brought out from Big Cities, 605 from State Capital/Metropolitan City, and 70 published from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.3.5 The largest circulated daily was “*Deccan Chronicle*” (English/daily) from Secundrabad with a circulation of 5,05,873 copies and “*Annadata*” (Telugu/monthly) from Hyderabad reported to be the largest circulated periodical with 2,98,546 copies per publishing day.

Registered Newspapers

9.4.1. Two new weekly publications were registered during 2014-15; one of these was in English and one was in other language. Total number of publications went to 25, comprising 09 dailies, 01 tri-biweekly, 11 weeklies, 02 monthlies, and 02 quarterlies. (Table 1)

9.4.2. Only 08 publications submitted their Annual Statements for 2014-15, which included 07 in English and 01 in Hindi. Their combined claimed circulation figure was 2,09,962 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.4.3 There were 04 publications from big city, 02 from the state capital and 02 the small town.

Leading Newspapers

9.4.4 The largest circulated daily was “*The Arunachal Times*”, an English Daily published from Itanagar with 49,050 copies per publishing day.

Registered Newspapers

9.5.1. 28 new publications were registered during 2014-15 in the state comprising 14 dailies, 10 weeklies, 01 each of fortnightly & monthly and 2 of other periodicities. The number of total registered publications rose to 682 comprising 127 dailies, 20 tri-bi weeklies, 239 weeklies, 81 fortnightlies, 154 monthlies, 32 quarterlies, 04 annuals and 25 of other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.5.2. In Assam out of 682 registered publications, as many as 117 publications filed their Annual Statements online in 2014-15. Among them, 78 were dailies, 25 weeklies, 07 monthlies, 02 tri/bi-weeklies, 04 fortnightlies and 01 quarterly. Language-wise, 50 Assamese publications filed annual statements, followed by 25 English and 17 Bengali language. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.5.3. Annual statements submitted were by the 117 publications claiming a total circulation of 38,09,432 copies per publishing day. Dailies accounted for the largest circulation with 28,99,277 copies per publishing day. Language-wise, Assamese press was at the top with 13,62,841 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.5.4 69 publications were being published from big cities, 38 from State Capital and 10 published from Small Towns.

Leading Newspaper

9.5.5. Among Dailies, "*The Sentinel*" in English language from Guwahati was the leading newspaper with 94,055 copies per publishing day in the state.

Registered Newspapers

9.6.1. 57 new publications were added in the registration record of the state during 2014-15, comprising 33 dailies, 09 weeklies, 12 monthlies, 01 quarterly and 02 of other periodicity. Now there are 1,858 registered publications in the state comprising 499 dailies, 33 tri-bi weeklies, 688 weeklies, 174 fortnightlies, 326 monthlies, 92 quarterlies, 43 other periodicals and 03 annuals. (Table 1)

9.6.2. In Bihar, 258 registered publications submitted their Annual Statements online for 2014-15. They included 184 dailies. Among periodicals, 33 were weeklies, 24 monthlies, 13 fortnightlies, 01 tri/bi-weekly and 02 quarterlies. Language-wise, as many as 148 publications were brought out in Hindi followed by 87 in Urdu. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.6.3. Circulation claimed by the 258 publications, accounted for 1,14,96,333 copies per publishing day in 2014-15. The share of dailies was 88,02,268 copies followed by the weeklies 18,46,569 copies per publishing day. The share of Hindi publication was 80,94,702 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.6.4. 81 publications were being published from Big Cities, 152 from State Capital, and remaining 25 were brought out from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.6.5. "*Hindustan*", a Hindi/daily from Patna was reported as a leading newspaper with daily circulation of 4,20,079 copies and "*Ravivasriya Hindustan*", Hindi/weekly from also from Patna was the leading periodical with a circulation of 4,21,942 copies per publishing day.

Registered Newspapers

9.7.1. 18 new publications were registered in the U.T. of Chandigarh during 2014-15, comprising 04 dailies, 10 weeklies, 02 monthlies and 02 of other periodicities. The number of registered newspapers & periodicals in Chandigarh has, therefore, risen to 545 in 2014-15. These include 70 dailies, 02 tri-bi weeklies, 138 weeklies, 39 fortnightlies, 201 monthlies, 51 quarterlies, 7 annuals and 37 of other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.7.2. Out of 545, only 71 publications from the UT Chandigarh submitted their Annual Statements for 2014-15. These were from 33 dailies, 29 weeklies, 06 monthlies, 01 fortnightly and 01 from tri/biweekly. The largest number of publications were being brought out in Hindi (30) and English (28) followed by Punjabi (06) and Bilingual (06). (Table 2)

Circulation

9.7.3. Total claimed circulation was 24,23,870 copies per publishing day. Dailies accounted for 16,39,091 copies, followed by Weeklies 6,68,783. Language-wise, Hindi papers were at top with a total circulations of 11,68,248 copies followed by English with 9,05,694 copies per publishing day (Table 2).

Leading Newspapers

9.7.4. "*The Tribune*", an English/daily from Chandigarh, was the highest circulated newspaper with a circulation of 3,49,765 copies. "*Sunday Hindustan Times*", an English/weekly was the leading periodical with 1,33,504 copies per publishing day.

Centres of Publication

9.7.5. All publications were being published from Chandigarh.

Registered Newspapers

9.8.1. 135 new publications were added in the list of registration record of the state during 2014-15. Of these, 18 were dailies, 43 weeklies, 09 fortnightlies, 54 monthlies, 09 quarterlies and 01 each of annual & of other periodicity. With this, the total number of newspapers & periodicals in the state has gone up to 1382, comprising 264 dailies, 02 tri-bi

weeklies, 538 weeklies, 97 fortnightlies, 370 monthlies, 79 quarterlies, 04 annuals and 28 other periodicals. (Table 1)

9.8.2. In all 336 publications submitted their Annual Statements for 2014-15, i.e. 166 dailies, 72 weeklies, 04 fortnightlies, 90 monthlies, 01 tri-bi weekly, 01 quarterly and 01 of other periodicity. Language-wise, 311 publications were published in Hindi, 06 in Urdu, 12 in English and 05 were in Bi-lingual. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.8.3. The total circulation claimed by 336 publications was 91,94,273 copies per publishing day. Dailies were at the top with 73,78,869 copies followed by weeklies with 8,89,547 and monthlies with 8,36,757 copies. Language-wise, Hindi press accounted for 86,27,881 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.8.4. 146 publications were published from Big Cities, 162 from State Capital and 28 from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.8.5. “*Hari Bhoomi*” from Raipur was the leading daily (Hindi) with a circulation of 2,52,551 copies per publishing day.

9.11.1. As many as 420 new publications were registered during 2014-15. Of these, 86 were dailies, 79 weeklies, 25 fortnightlies, 173 monthlies, 26 quarterlies, 02 annuals and 29 of other periodicities. Three monthlies, two weeklies, two fortnightlies and one quarterly of English Language publications, one Hindi monthly and one Bi-lingual monthly have ceased their publication during the year under report. Thus, the total number of registered newspapers & periodicals in the State rose to 14,394. These included 1,493 dailies, 53 tri/bi-weeklies, 6,434 weeklies, 1,098 fortnightlies, 3,612 monthlies, 818 quarterlies, 306 annuals and 580 with other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.22.2. From the State of Maharashtra, 1516 publications submitted their Annual Statements for the period 2014-15. Annual Statements were submitted by 539 dailies, 641 weeklies, 57 fortnightlies, 222 monthlies, 14 quarterlies, 04 tri/bi-weeklies, 17 other periodicities and 22 annuals. Language-wise, 866 annual statements were from Marathi, 263 from English and 208 from Hindi publications. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.22.3. The above 1,516 publications claimed a total circulation of 4,27,89,878 copies per publishing day in 2014-15. Dailies had the largest share of 2,53,37,444 copies per publishing day. Among periodicals weeklies had the largest circulation of 1,24,24,743 copies followed by monthlies 29,27,759 copies and fortnightlies 15,28,390 copies. Language-wise, Marathi publications were leading in circulation with 2,30,97,891 copies followed by English with 1,01,03,909 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.22.4. As many as 913 publications were brought out from Big Cities, 462 from Metropolitan City and 141 from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.22.5. *The Times of India*, an English/daily from Mumbai with a circulation of 8,93,796 copies was the leading newspaper while *The Sunday Times Of India*, an English/weekly from Mumbai with a circulation of 8,65,049 copies was top among periodicals.

Registered Newspapers

9.30.1. As many as 303 new publications were registered during 2014-15. Out of these, 70 were dailies, 54 weeklies, 113 fortnightlies, 54 monthlies, 10 quarterlies and 02 of other periodicities. Two dailies and one fortnightly of Hindi Language ceased their publications during the period under report. The total number of registered newspapers and periodicals in the State has increased to 6,045 consisting of 794 dailies, 22 tri-bi/weeklies,

1,512 weeklies, 2,231 fortnightlies, 1,140 monthlies, 216 quarterlies, 21 annuals and 109 with other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.30.2. The total number of annual statements received from the state of Rajasthan was 1,656. These included 439 dailies, 366 weeklies, 677 fortnightlies, 156 monthlies, 13 quarterlies, 01 annual and 04 with other periodicities. Language-wise, Hindi newspapers comprised the largest number 1,502, in online submission of Annual Statements. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.30.3. The 1,656 publications that submitted their annual statements claimed a circulation of 2,66,96,187 copies per publishing day during 2014-15. Dailies commanded a circulation of 1,80,19,721 copies. Among periodicals, fortnightlies with 41,15,520 copies were leading and followed by weeklies with 36,17,390 copies, which was further followed by monthly with 8,63,992 copies per publishing day. Language-wise, Hindi newspapers were the most circulated with 2,50,13,247 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.30.4. 754 were published from Big Cities, 612 from the State Capital and 290 from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.30.5. *Dainik Bhaskar*, a Hindi/daily from Jaipur, was the leading newspaper with 4,92,238 copies per publishing day. *Rashtra Doot*, a Hindi/Weekly from Jaipur, with a circulation of 2,53,110 copies, was leader among periodicals.

Registered Newspapers

9.32.1. A total number of 313 new publications were registered in 2014-15. These were 13 dailies, 42 weeklies, 43 fortnightlies, 190 monthlies, 12 quarterlies, 03 annuals and 10 of other periodicities. One English monthly ceased its operation during the year. Thus, the total number of registered newspapers and periodicals has gone up to 5,820 comprising 519 dailies, 57 tri/bi-weeklies, 774 weeklies, 697 fortnightlies, 3,288 monthlies, 262 quarterlies, 45 annuals and 178 with other periodicities. Dailies had a share of 76,14,421 copies, weeklies of 44,57,728 copies and monthlies 16,58,663 copies per publishing day. Language-wise, Tamil publications had a circulation of 85,64,991 copies, followed by English 50,42,886 copies. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.32.4. 188 publications were brought out from Big Cities and 246 from Metropolitan Cities and 28 from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.32.5. *Daily Thanthi*, Tamil daily published from Chennai had the largest circulation of 4,98,091 copies and among periodicals *The Hindu Weekly*, an English weekly published from Chennai with a circulation of 3,59,525 copies was on top position.

9.33.1. The study of press in newly formed state 'Telangana' (created on 02nd June, 2014) is included first time in the analysis of Press in India after its formation. Registered Newspapers

9.35.1. As many as 928 new publications were registered during the year 2014-15. These comprised of 371 dailies, 309 weeklies, 43 fortnightlies, 167 monthlies, 27 quarterlies, 04 annuals and 07 of other periodicities. Three weeklies, two dailies and two monthlies of Hindi language were reported to be ceased during the period under report. Thus, by the end of 2014-15, the number of registered newspapers and periodicals has increased to 16,130, which was the largest in the country. Periodicity-wise break up of these publications was 2,936 dailies, 24 tri/bi-weeklies, 8,071 weeklies, 1,339 fortnightlies, 2,727 monthlies, 668 quarterlies, 45 annuals and 330 with other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.35.2. Annual statements from 5,460 publications were received from Uttar Pradesh in 2014-15. The annual statements were received in respect of 2,048 dailies, 2,565 weeklies, 267 fortnightlies, 502 monthlies, 62 quarterlies, 03 annuals and 13 with other periodicities. Language wise, Hindi and Urdu were on first and second position in filing annual statements with 4,350 & 786 publications respectively. (Table 2)

Circulation

9.35.3. The 5460 publications, which submitted their Annual Statements, had a combined circulation of 11,93,25,618 copies per publishing day during 2014-15. Dailies claimed a total circulation of 6,33,54,550 copies. Among periodicals weeklies were leading with a circulation of 4,24,37,061 copies per publishing day. Language-wise, Hindi newspapers had a circulation of 9,30,59,566 copies followed by Urdu with 1,97,43,988 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.35.4. As many as 2,535 publications were published from Big Cities and 2,022 from the State Capital and remaining 903 from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.35.5. *Dainik Jagran*, a Hindi Daily from Kanpur, was the highest circulated newspaper with 3,28,712 copies. *Amar Ujala Udan*, a Hindi/weekly from Gautam Budh Nagar, was at the highest among periodicals with a circulation of 4,22,753 copies per publishing day.

Registered Newspapers

9.36.1. In all, 102 new publications were registered during 2014-15 in West Bengal. These included 15 dailies, 19 weeklies, 20 fortnightlies, 31 monthlies, 10 quarterlies, 06 of other Periodicities and 01 annual. One each of Hindi daily, weekly and monthly ceased their publication during 2014-15. Thus, the total number of registered newspapers and periodicals went up to 5,188 by the end of 2014-15. There were 287 dailies, 11 tri/bi-weeklies, 960 weeklies, 992 fortnightlies, 1,549 monthlies, 898 quarterlies, 61 annuals and 430 with other periodicities. (Table 1)

9.36.2. As many as 356 annual statements were received from the publishers in West Bengal in 2014-15. These included 112 dailies, 01 tri or bi-weekly, 84 weeklies, 60 fortnightlies, 78 monthlies, 16 quarterlies, 01 annual and 04 with other periodicities (Table 2).

Circulation

9.36.3. The above 356 publishers had a combined circulation of 1,09,39,944 copies per publishing day during 2014-15. Among these the share of dailies was 68,34,831 copies, followed by weeklies 24,02,257 copies. Language-wise, Bengali publications maintained the highest total circulation with 59,78,587 copies, followed by English with 25,99,522 copies and Hindi with 11,36,737 copies per publishing day. (Table 2)

Centres of Publication

9.36.4. In all 155 publications were being published from Big Cities and 175 were published from State Capital/Metropolitan City and 26 were published from Small Towns.

Leading Newspapers

9.36.5. *Ananda Bazar Patrika*, a Bengali daily published from Kolkata commanded the largest circulation of 11,78,779 copies in the newspapers category and *Karmasangsthaan*, Bengali/weekly published from Kolkata with a circulation of 3,16,351 copies was highest circulated periodical in the state.
